# MELISSA SMITH

District 44

## How will you give back to Montana as an elected official?

I want to protect our great state constitution and make sure that our state budget and surplus is invested in Montana communities- particularly affordable housing, public land conservation and public safety. The Republican party is currently two seats away from a super-majority, which would enable them to call for a constitutional convention. I believe in the rights of all Montanans, regardless of party, and intend to engage with each of my constituents according to their individual needs and ideas for building a better, stronger community.

## How will you make sure young adults have access to voting?

Before last year, Montana already had some of the most secure, most accessible elections in the US. ## How will you give back to Montana as an elected official?

I am a public defender, a small business owner, and a lifelong Montanan. I will use my decade of legal experience to help draft better laws. I can read and understand bills that lobbyists will write. I'll help steer the Legislature towards laws that benefit everyone, not just special interests. I have represented dozens of patients who have been committed to Montana State Hospital (Warm Springs). I want to use my expertise in that field to rewrite our mental health commitment code so we can tackle Montana's mental health problems in a smarter and more proactive way.

## How will you make sure young adults have access to voting?

I strongly support same-day voter registration and permitting various forms of ID, including a student ID. Our state must make voting as easy as possible, not more difficult. The previous Legislature passed many measures that curtailed voting protections for young people and college students. They have fortunately been overturned by the courts, but threats to our right to vote remain. My opponent, unfortunately, voted to restrict your right to vote. I urge you to cast your vote for a candidate who will protect your rights.

## What actions will you take to protect MT's environment for generations to come?

I support Montana's ongoing transition to clean, renewable energy using a wide variety of resources such as solar, wind, hydroelectric, geothermal, and safe nuclear energy. I support "net metering," which means that when you connect a solar panel and send power back into the grid, you should receive a credit on your electric bill. I will oppose any measure that weakens Montana's clean air and water quality standards. As a Butte native, I have witnessed the long-term effects of environmental damage firsthand; we cannot let that happen again.

## How will you give back to Montana as an elected official?

## How will you make sure young adults have access to voting?

Young adults already have access to voting. Any 18 year old just needs a valid driver's license, a state issued ID card, a tribal ID card, a passport, or a military ID to vote, all of which can be obtained any time, not just during election years. Voter registration is easily accomplished in our state at any time, not just during election years. Forms are available from most counties online and in person at the County Election Office.

## What actions will you take to protect MT's environment for generations to come?

Montana's environment is in good shape, as long as we keep doing the things we are doing. I would encourage responsible harvesting of our forests to help prevent wasteful forest fires, I would encourage responsible drilling and fracking of our oil and natural gas treasures, and I would encourage your generation to honor our wild lands and our cities as your parents and grandparents have done.
